Two Freyer Scholarships, comprising a full fee waiver (value: €13,750), are available. These scholarships are aimed at academic programmes in science, bioinnovation, and ICT. Applications for the scholarship are welcomed from Indian students* seeking to enter one of the selected taught Master's programmes at NUI Galway.

Three Macauliffe Scholarships, comprising a full fee waiver (value: €13,750), are available. These scholarships are aimed at academic programmes in all areas of the NUI Galway curriculum.

Postgraduate Merit Scholarships (Value: €2,750)

Twenty five Postgraduate Merit Scholarships, comprising a partial fee waiver (value: €2,750), are available. These scholarships are aimed at postgraduate programmes in all areas of the NUI Galway curriculum.

Undergraduate Merit Scholarships (Value: €2,750)

Ten Undergraduate Merit Scholarships, comprising a partial fee waiver (value: €2,750), are available. These scholarships are aimed at undergraduate programmes in all areas of the NUI Galway curriculum.

Government of Ireland Scholarship (Value: €21,250):

This scholarship is co-funded by the Irish Government and comprises a full tuition waiver plus a stipend of €7,500 to cover living expenses for one year. NUI Galway have participated in the schedule in previous years and hope to do so again for the September 2016 intake.


History
